- Develop training materials and find various means to train and develop future church leaders and teach-



Why Press on with the message of the gospel?

According to WorthyNews.com, over the past 40 years, Protestant Ethiopians have grown rapidly from fewer than 200,000 to 12 million, nearly 20 percent of the country's population.

This encouraging statistical information is not taking place without cost. What we are referring to is the cost of lives and the cost that many brothers and sisters pay each day for their faith in Jesus Christ and their commitment to the teachings of

God's word among nonbelievers. It was reported that this year alone, evangelical pastors, evangelists and lay ministers, who are on the front line proclaiming the gospel, have been attacked. Not only have there been verbal harassment and attacks on character. but meetings have been disrupted by mobs, known Christian's homes have been looted and burned, and recently, both a pastor and an evangelist were beaten to death. These

attacks came from other, non-evangelical religious groups who oppose the doctrine of salvation ONLY through the finished work of our Savior and Lord Jesus Christ. In spite of all the dangers surrounding them and their loved ones, these brothers and sisters continue to press forward to make the Savior known among the lost.

For those of us who have been saved, grace is what we have experienced. God continues to give us grace as we live our lives for Him. We read in the apostle Paul's letter to the believers in Thessalonica that he attempted to encourage them be-

cause the grace of God is sufficient for every trial. (2 Thessalonians 1:1-12).

In addition to grace from the Lord, Paul mentions the peace that comes from the Father. Peace in God follows the grace of God. Paul reiterates the truth about the peace of God in his letter to the Philippians: "...Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made

> known to God. And the peace understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus." (Philippians 4:6-7 ESV)

> God allows us to go through afflictions to help us mature in our spiritual walk as he did in the lives of many saints mentioned in the Scriptures. Just think of Abraham and Job. Encouragement comes from knowing that we can grow in Christ even if we

are persecuted for His sake. Our hope in Christ gives us strength against all kinds of persecution.

Paul encouraged the believers of his time in Thessalonica with the truth that **afflictions** strengthen spiritual growth and commended them in his first letter for their faith, love, and hope. We are called to do the same for the believers in Ethiopia and elsewhere—to be the source
